VISION

PROJECT HIGHLIGHT -**CLOTHING RECYCLE**

This year's Clothing Recycle Project was a tremendous success, collecting over 30,000 pieces of clothing, totaling more than 17,000 lbs.

Through systematic distributions coordinated with various agencies and social units, we reached thousands of individuals in need across Trinidad and Tobago and beyond:

- Distributed clothing to families identified by Members of Parliament and Local Government Councillors, coordinated by the Ministry of Rural Development and Local Government.
- Supported fire victims in partnership with the Trinidad and Tobago Fire Service.
- Partnered with the Ministry of Social Development to distribute en masse to 17 organizations aiding the homeless, elderly, displaced, vulnerable children, and survivors of abuse.
- Provided business attire to participants of the On the Job (OJT) Programme and Hugh Wooding Law School.
- Sent 4,500 pieces of clothing to Hurricane Beryl victims in Grenada, Carriacou, and Petite Martinique.



Of the clothing collected, approximately 2,000 lbs were disqualified. However, around 1,200 lbs were repurposed for use by farmers, mechanics, and crafters, while 800 lbs were discarded.

The project's success was made possible by 200 volunteers who contributed an astounding 3,000 volunteer hours to screen, section, size, lay out, and distribute the clothing within just six weeks.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all our partners, volunteers, and donors for making this initiative a beacon of sustainability and community care. Together, we have proven the power of collective action!
